Each tour will take approximately 90 minutes. Please meet at the main door of Newry Cathedral. You will hear the story of the building of Newry Cathedral, 1825-1829, and of the later extensions. The history of its stained glass, marble altars, sculptures and magnificent mosaics. **There is no charge for these tours.**

Who celebrates the liturgy?

The entire Body of Christ, animated by the Holy Spirit, celebrates the liturgy. Liturgy is not a matter of private prayer but a public act of worship by the faithful gathered together by the Holy Spirit under the authority of the bishop, their teacher and shepherd. The faithful are called to come to the liturgy consciously prepared to make their thoughts agree with what they say and hear and to cooperate with divine grace.

Within the assembly, the ordained ministers have a unique function of service. For example, priests preside at the Eucharist, acting in the person of Christ, the Head of the Church and in the name of the Church when presenting to God the prayers and offerings of the people.
